Important Pre-departure Information

To board your flight you must have a valid passport and Chinese visa on your person. Never pack your passport! Make sure your passport is valid throughout the trip. We strongly advise you to make two copies of your passport. Leave one at home with your parents or guardian and bring one with you in case of loss or theft. Please keep the photocopy of your passport in a separate place from your actual passport.

Be sure to check-in at least 3 hours prior to the departure of your flight!

AIFS Round-Trip Flights

Transfers to and from campus are included for students who have booked their flights with AIFS, but only on the arrival/ departure dates and from the local airport as indicated in the 2007 AIFS Summer catalog. Seating assignments, if possible, must be made directly with the airline.

If you have a domestic connecting flight

If you have a domestic flight connecting your international flight, please be at the airport three hours prior to the scheduled departure time. Upon arrival at the airport, proceed directly to the check-in counter to check your bags and obtain your boarding pass(es). Show all your tickets to the counter agent and be sure to request that your luggage be "interlined" straight through to your final destination (Beijing). If you do not interline your luggage, you will have to collect it upon arrival for the international flight and check it through again.

Within the United States

If you are delayed on the way to the airport and think you are going to miss the flight, telephone the College Division Duty Officer in the Stamford Office. You may reach the Duty Officer by calling **1-800-727-2437**. This number is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

If your flight is cancelled, you miss your flight or you are transferred to another flight by the airline please call the AIFS emergency number **1-800-727-2437** before you leave the U.S. so that we can have someone meet you when your new flight arrives. Airlines will not contact AIFS if they put you on a different flight and by law they cannot give out passenger flight information. If you

cannot call before leaving the U.S. please contact AIFS representative Chloe Wang 1364 621 3839 on arrival in Shanghai.
