#### ACADEMIC YEAR

Golden West College offers classes on the semester system throughout the academic year. The fall and spring semesters are sixteen weeks in length; the summer semester is eight weeks; and the winter intersession is four-weeks.

#### GRADING

Student performance in courses is indicated by one of twenty grades. Grades which carry point value, and which are used in determining the grade point average (GPA), are as follows:

#### SCHOLASTIC HONORS

# **COURSE REPETITION POLICY**

Only courses which fall into the following categories may be repeated. Enrollment in two sections of the same course is not permitted.

Prior to Spring 2008, courses designated AB, AC, etc. may be repeated for credit; however, they may not be taken concurrently. Courses with AB, AC, or AD designations may be taken for credit according to the following schedule:

AB designation: may be taken twice for credit.
AC designation: may be taken three times for credit.
AD designation: may be taken four times for credit.
As of Spring 2008, courses which may be repeated for credit are AB designation: notated in the college catalog.

Courses in which a substandard grade (D, F and/or NC/NP) was received. Students may repeat a course in which a substandard grade was earned
